Coral Street Campus Overview

HOUSING MATTERS

Rebele Family Shelter

Shelter for up to 28 families (approximately 100 people) experiencing homelessness

Paul Lee Loft

Emergency shelter for 57 adult individuals

Page Smith Community House

Transitional housing for up to 40 adults; individual bedrooms with shared living and kitchen spaces. This program is phasing out to make way for Harvey West Studios: 120 units of Permanent Supportive Housing on campus

Recuperative Care Center

Medical respite shelter for 12 adults recovering from a recent hospital stay

Day Services

Mail room, showers, and bathrooms; bathrooms open 24/7, showers open 7:00a - 3:00p daily

Dining Hall

Serving three meals daily to all residents in shelter

Administrative Offices

Offices for 70+ Housing Matters employees

OTHER SERVICE PROVIDERS

Homeless Persons Health Project (HPPH)

County-run walk-in medical clinic for low-income and homeless individuals, providing 5300 visits annually

Dientes Community Dental Care

Small dental clinic providing free basic dental care services, serving 200 clients annually

Various Community Groups

Community groups hold meetings, support groups, presentations, outreach services, and more on our campus and in Housing Matters' Community Room

TOTAL IMPACT of CORAL STREET CAMPUS

2500+ people served annually, campus-wide

220 people in shelter/transitional housing at any given time

5567 medical and dental visits annually
