Description

Under the supervision of the Facilities Manager, the Custodian will be responsible for maintaining the cleanliness of Housing Matters multiple buildings, including the Rebele Family Shelter, the Day Services Center, and the Page Smith Community House and Recuperative Care Center.

Typical Job Duties:

- Clean bathrooms
- Clean offices
- Clean rooms as needed and upon vacancy
- Clean windows
- Sweeping and mopping
- Operate compactor/take out trash
- Operate carpet cleaning machine
- Operate power washing machine
- Light maintenance repairs
- Other duties as assigned
